Summer Weather

As I communicated earlier, heat is a factor in Tauranga this time of year. We will therefore implement the following during February.

1. Children who have one, can wear their physical education uniform. This is black shorts and the green St Mary's PE T Shirt. Both items are available from NZ Uniforms.
2. Year 1 students (rooms 1-5) unfortunately

occupy older classrooms that are not well equipped when it comes to ventilation. Those year 1 parents who may be concerned that the afternoons will get too hot for their children are welcome to collect them at lunch time on extremely hot days. This will be an individual parent decision with those children remaining cared for within their classrooms.

3. Sunblock, all classrooms are equipped with sun block and children are encouraged to self manage the application of this. If your child is more susceptible to the effects of the sun please ensure you apply sunscreen before you drop them to school.
4. Hydration, most important and can be easily achieved with access to a water bottle during the day.

School Buses

I am aware, as many are, of some of the teething problems currently being experienced as a result of our recent change of bus routes and city provider. I take child safety seriously and so have offered to work with Bay of Plenty Regional Council Transport Operations Officer to ensure current issues are resolved and the efficient service we all hope for is gained in the near future. 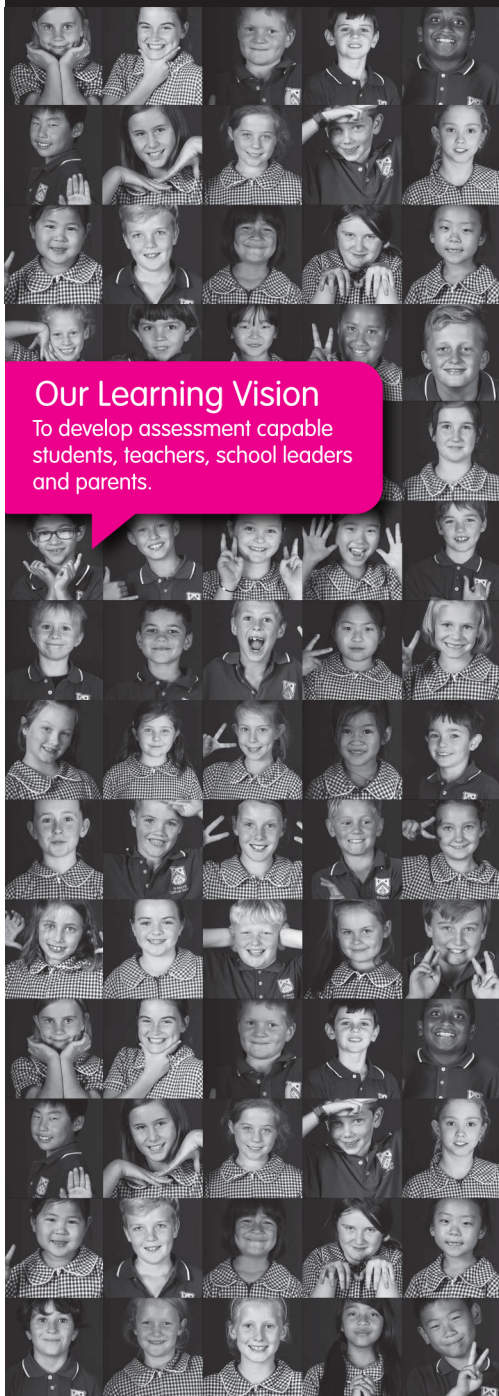

Nuts & Bolts



Sign in and out

In case of an emergency and for Health and Safety reasons we need to know who is on the school grounds. We therefore ask that you use the tablet at the school reception desk to sign in and out.



Reasons you need to use the tablet;

- Child late. **Sign in.**
- Child leaving school for an appointment, or because he / she became sick during school time. **Sign out.**
- Parent / friend / family member is helping during school hours or attending a class Mass or school event. **Sign in and out.**
- Child returning from an appointment. **Sign in.**

Absences

If your child is absent from school, please notify by phone or text, the school office before 9.00am on the morning of the absence. When a child returns to school after an absence he/she should bring a written explanation from his/her parents or caregivers.

Accidents and Illness at School

Three teachers are on duty at all times during the morning and lunchtime breaks.

Accidents of a minor nature are treated at school in the medical room. Parents, or a nominated adult are contacted if an accident is of a serious nature. If parents are not able to be contacted, the school will use discretion in obtaining medical aid.

Parents will be notified if their child becomes ill and needs care at home.

Parking

The safety of our students is paramount.

We request that all parents take due care and diligence in respect to parking around the school.

- St Mary's School enjoys good relationships with our neighbours. We ask that you respect their driveways and grass verges and do **NOT** park over them, or on them.
- Please do **NOT** park in the bus bay.
- If you are parked on the opposite side of the road to school, we ask that you meet your child/ren on the school side and escort them over the road.
- The school grounds is for staff parking only. Please do **NOT** park or drive into the school grounds unless permission has been granted by

PTA

St Mary's PTA can lay claim to a proud record of fundraising, pastoral care and providing a vital link between home and school. There are many facilities and school equipment that have been provided through the hard work of interested parents. A number of social activities are organised so that parents can get to know one another and can work towards a common goal. Any parent who wishes to join the PTA should attend a meeting which is usually held on the second Tuesday of the month. The next meeting is on **Tuesday 12 February**. We would love to see as many new parents as possible.

Parent Involvement

We encourage and value parental input with many school events which involve pupils, staff and parents. These include assisting the teacher in class, sports days, displays, field trips, fundraising and other activities throughout the year. Assistance with transport requires that the driver has a current full driver's license; the car has a current Warrant of Fitness and Registration and seatbelts for all passengers. On Monday mornings there is a Liturgy and on Thursday mornings there is usually a class Mass. Parents and family members are welcome and are encouraged to attend.

Swimming

Swimming is a mandatory part of the PE Programme. All children will participate with their class unless a note from parents is provided. Please ensure that all gear is clearly named.

Children may ride bicycles to school.

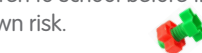
A helmet must be worn at all times.
